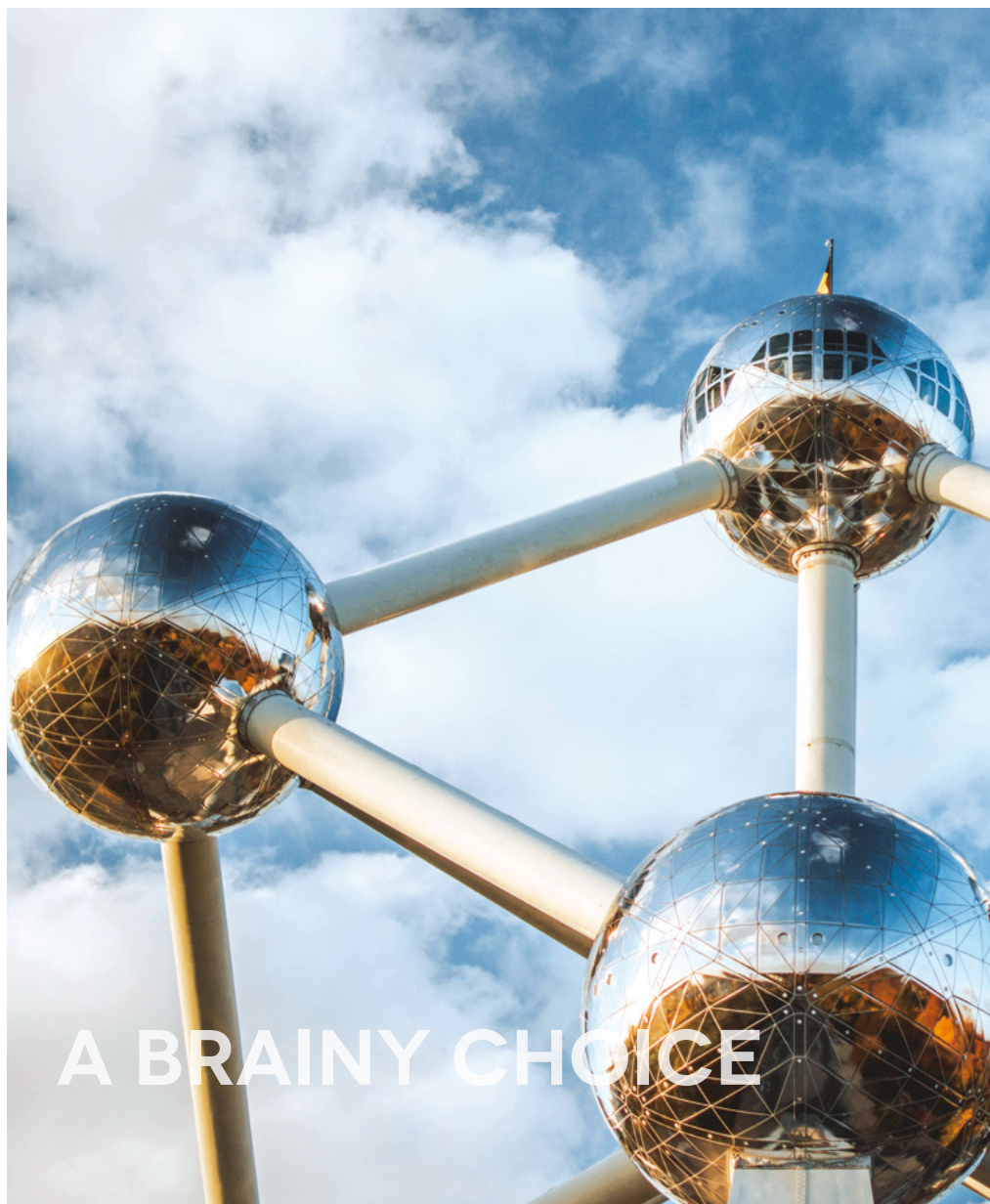

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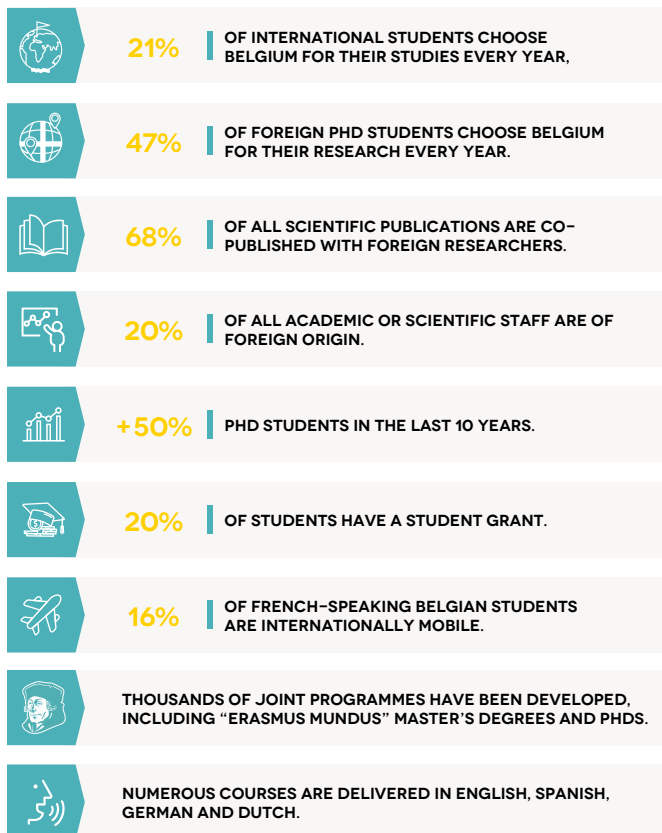

The internationalisation of Belgian higher education in figures

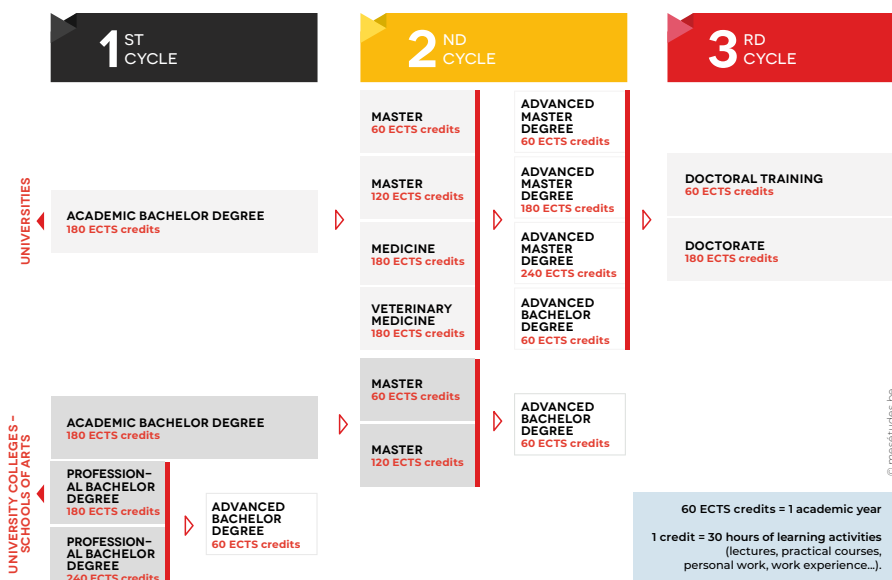

Belgian qualifications recognised worldwide

In French-speaking Belgium, higher education is based on a system of three cycles of studies: the bachelor's degree, the master's degree and the PhD. Each qualification obtained gives you ECTS credits, which are recognised in numerous countries in both the European Union and worldwide. As an adhering member of this system, the Wallonia-Brussels Federation is committed to guaranteeing the quality of higher education, promoting student mobility and strengthening the globalisation of its higher education.

How higher education works

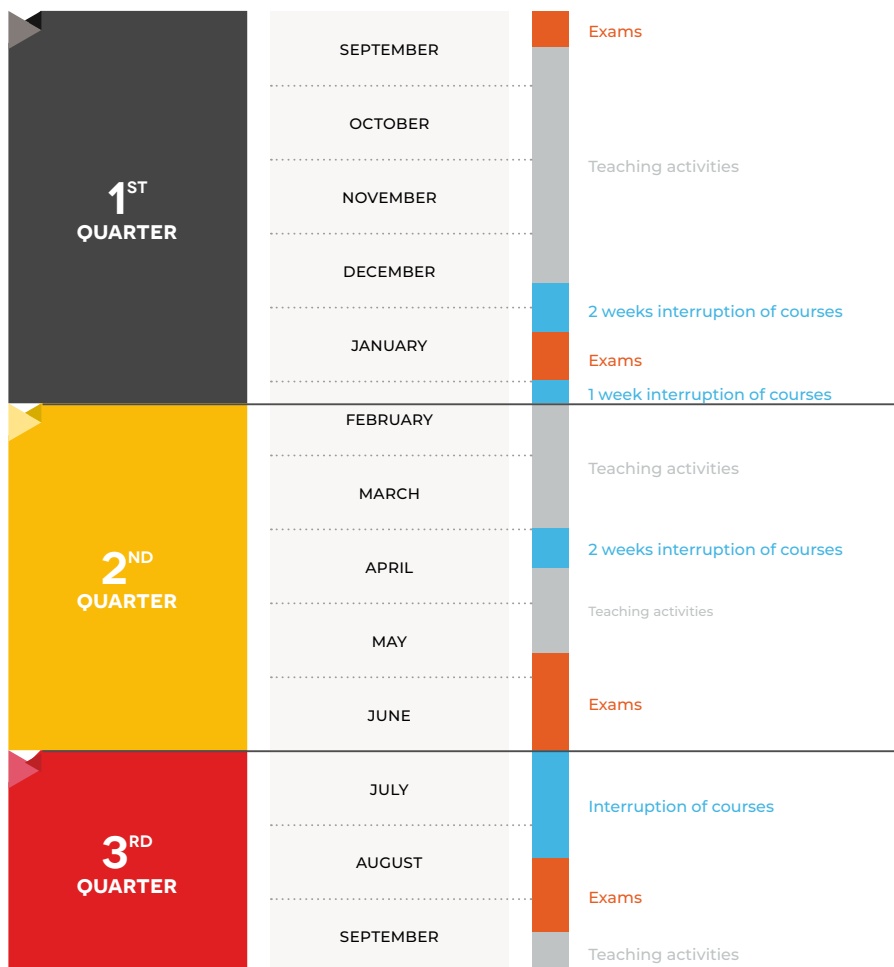


The award of the qualifications (bachelor's degree, master's degree and PhD) is linked to the number of years of studies completed since entering higher education. Each year can award up to 60 ECTS credits (European Credits Transfer System), which can be used and transferred from one country to another.

- A 1st cycle qualification (bachelor's degree) represents 180 or 240 ECTS credits, namely 3 or 4 years of study.
- A 2nd cycle qualification (master's degree) represents 60, 120 or 180 ECTS credits, namely 1, 2 or 3 years of study.
- A 3rd cycle qualification (PhD) represents a variable number of ECTS credits.

Academic calendar

As a rule, the calendar of an academic year in French-speaking Belgium is divided up into three terms. Learning is split over the first two terms, except for certain assessments or professional integration activities.

Theoretical and scientific education

Spread throughout the Wallonia-Brussels Federation territory, the French-speaking universities of Belgium offer their students quality education. The options are divided up into four fields of study: science and technology, human sciences, health sciences and art.

Research at the heart of the French-speaking Belgian university course

In addition to in-depth knowledge of the chosen subject, the Wallonian and Brussels based universities offer a solid general education, encouraging their students to take a scientific approach. This is why the focus is firmly on research, both basic and applied. And it is this philosophy that makes the universities of French-speaking Belgium institutions that are famous for the excellence of their research programmes and have earned them a remarkable reputation both in our country and beyond. As indeed is proven by the numerous Nobel prize winners who have come out of our institutions: 4 Nobel prize-winners for medicine, 5 for peace, 1 for literature, 1 for chemistry and 1 for physics!

How are university studies organised?

The universities offer long-term education programmes made up of two cycles:

- a 1st cycle (180 ECTS credits) that takes the students up to Academic bachelor's degree level, i.e. its main aim is to prepare for the master degree that follows;
- a 2nd cycle, leading to a master degree (60, 120 or 180 ECTS credits).

These two cycles can be followed by a 3rd, a PhD.

UNIVERSITÉ CATHOLIQUE DE LOUVAIN (UCLouvain)

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Founded in 1425, the University of Louvain (UCLouvain) is one of Europe's oldest universities. It has 40,000 students, 20% of whom are international, spread over 7 campuses, the main one located in a unique environment a few kilometres south of Brussels and 3 others in the heart of the capital. UCLouvain is the country's leading French-speaking university and is ranked as Belgium's top university for sustainable development in the Times Higher Education (THE) rankings.

UCLouvain offers high-quality teaching in all disciplines, thanks to its 20 faculties and research activities focused on current societal issues such as climate change, democracy, global health, sustainable development and innovation. With 60 ERC (European Research Council) grants and numerous other international awards, teaching at UCLouvain is based on solid research and innovation, with many practical applications for society, as illustrated by the 72 spin-offs and over 270 companies in the university's two science parks. UCLouvain also has two university hospitals, one located in Brussels (Cliniques universitaires Saint-Luc) and the other at the heart of Wallonia (CHU UCL Namur).

UCLouvain is part of the Circle U. European University alliance together with Aarhus University, King's College London, Humboldt University in Berlin, Université Paris-Cité, University of Belgrade, University of Pisa, University of Oslo and University of Vienna.

Since September 2023, the Université Saint-Louis - Bruxelles has merged with UCLouvain to become one of its campuses. Saint-Louis - Brussels is a campus on a human scale, with a strong emphasis on welcoming students and providing them with personalised support and guidance. It is also recognised for the quality of its bilingual and trilingual programmes, which it has been organising for over thirty years, and for its innovative facilities for intensive foreign language learning.

UNIVERSITÉ DE LIÈGE (ULIÈGE)

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University of Liège (ULiège) is one of Belgium's leading universities. ULiège is the public university of the Wallonia-Brussels Federation. It includes 11 Faculties representing the Humanities, Health Sciences, Sciences and Technology. ULiège welcomes 26,600 students, 24% of whom are of international origin (130 nationalities). Its range of undergraduate and postgraduate courses is among the most diversified in Belgium. ULiège is located in 3 cities in Wallonia: Liège, Gembloux and Arlon. ULiège is a major employer in Wallonia: more than 5,800 employees, including 16% Academic staff (professors) and 48% involved in teaching and research activities. Together with the University Hospital (CHU) of Liège, this represents 13,000 direct jobs spread over the provinces of Liège, Namur and Luxembourg.

With 39 bachelor's degrees and 193 master's degrees, ULiège's range of undergraduate and postgraduate courses is among the most diversified in Belgium. ULiège's educational programs are granted with several international quality labels (EQUIS, AACSB, AEEEV, Conférence des Grandes Ecoles, EMT). ULiège boosts its research centres in fields such as biotechnology, life and medical sciences (human and veterinary), agronomy, space and engineering sciences, environment by developing partnerships with public authorities and companies. More than 100 spin-off companies created by ULiège are in activity. The Humanities disciplines, in all their diversity (philosophy, letters, social sciences, legal and economic sciences, psychology, etc.) contribute to a fertile intellectual life, provide services to society and individuals, and benefit from major resources (libraries, heritage collections, archives, etc.). The University of Liège is the depository of a large part of the archives of the world-renowned writer Georges Simenon.

UNIVERSITÉ DE MONS (UMONS)

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UMONS was created in 2009 following a merger between the Université de Mons-Hainaut and the Faculty of Engineering of Mons, the university's oldest faculty.

UMONS is one of the founding members of the Pôle hainuyer, one of the five academic clusters instituted in the Wallonia-Brussels Federation under the scope of the restructuring of higher education. It assumes the co-presidency of this cluster, which groups together 3 universities, 3 university colleges, 3 schools of arts and 26 continuing education institutions, and offers nearly 600 courses in 21 fields of education to more than 30,000 students in the province of Hainaut.

With more than 900 researchers, research objectives in UMONS are pursued both regionally and internationally. The common goal of all UMONS researchers is to develop expertise on a large scale, subsequently benefiting society, particularly the region.

Accommodating students in a learning environment suited to the individual is a priority of UMONS. Through the education on offer at UMONS, we promote critical thinking, open-mindedness, tolerance, responsibility, and autonomy, and develop students' and researchers' intellectual, cultural and human experiences in order for them to become responsible members of society.

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Founded in 1831 by the Society of Jesus, the University of Namur carries on in its teaching and research the humanistic values of openness, excellence, freedom, and sustainability. Located in the heart of Europe, in the French-speaking part of Belgium, in Namur — the capital of Wallonia — the University welcomes around 7,200 students across 7 faculties, offering more than 90 academic programs. Practical, professional education

All the French-speaking university colleges of Belgium offer a quality education, liaising closely with applied research, universities, and socio-professional environments. Differently to the universities, the teaching employed in the university colleges is hinged on learning and the world of work. The theoretical and conceptual aspects are all part of the programme with a heavy focus on internships, which are mandatory. University colleges account for about 45% of the student population.

How are university colleges studies organised?

- Studies organised as a single cycle, leading to a professional bachelor's degree (180 - 240 ECTS credits).
- Studies organised into two cycles, leading to an academic bachelor's degree (1st cycle - 180 ECTS credits) and master (2nd cycle - 60 to 120 ECTS credits).
- Studies organised into one or two cycles, leading to an advanced bachelor's degree. This can be obtained after having successfully completed an initial bachelor's or master's degree. The advanced bachelor's degree contains at least 60 ECTS credits.

Today, HELHa is the largest University College in the Wallonia-Brussels Federation. HELHa aims to become a key player in higher education in French-speaking Belgium, training professionals with high added value: expertise, self-fulfilment and solidarity. To become a benchmark, our University College is putting in place conditions promoting the success of its students, at academic, professional and personal levels. The aim is to train professionals who are in step with developments in the world of work and society, while maintaining a welcoming and friendly atmosphere.

In a nutshell, HELHa is :

- 4 separate departments, namely the Department of Arts, Business and Communication, the Department of Health and Medical Technologies, the Department of Education and Social Work and the Department of Sciences and Life Technologies;

Internationally recognised education in artistic techniques

The internationally renowned schools of arts in French-speaking Belgium have very different sizes, varying from 75 students up to a thousand. In total, it represents around 8000 students. Schools of arts offer quality education in five fields of study: dance; music; theatre; plastic, visual and spatial arts; and performing arts and broadcasting communication techniques. They aim to be multidisciplinary places of research and creation and are strongly focused on students' artistic projects. They train not only artists, but also pedagogues and social actors to respond to the realities of the field and of society.

How are schools of arts studies organised?

After passing an admission test, schools of arts offer:

- One cycle leading to a professional bachelor's degree (180 to 240 ECTS credits).
- In two or three cycles:
 - a 1st cycle leading to the award of an academic bachelor's degree (180 ECTS credits),
 - a 2nd cycle leading to the award of a master's degree (60 to 120 ECTS credits),
 - in collaboration with universities, a 3rd cycle in art and art sciences lead to the award of a PhD.

The training focuses on learning artistic know-how and developing relevant, autonomous and unique creative approaches. The student, his experience and his self-construction are at the center of the educational project. This is a differentiated pedagogy; it is focused on learning, exchange and experimentation. Through numerous exchanges and partnerships, whether regional, national or international, the Fine Arts open up to the world and are part of a network that allows students to be actors in a vast artistic community.

CONSERVATOIRE ROYAL DE BRUXELLES

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Founded in 1832, the Royal Conservatoire of Brussels is an Arts College run by the Federation Wallonia-Brussels. It is one of the oldest institutions for arts education in Belgium. While building on its prestigious past, the current work of the Conservatoire looks to the future, with a focus on delivering high quality education. We constantly strive to develop excellent methods of teaching to ensure that every student, whether musician or actor, can find themselves as an artist and follow their chosen path.

The tradition of the Conservatoire Royal de Bruxelles is maintained by a faculty of the highest quality both in terms of teaching skills and as performers in their own right.

The teaching methods have continually evolved in order to help our student musicians and actors fully develop their potential and find their own, individual, artistic pathway. In particular, teaching has been reformed and new courses introduced in line with the changing requirements of artistic and professional life. To this end, new departments have been created, such as the Jazz department, the Early Music department, or, more recently, the department of Pedagogy and the department of Rhythms and rhythmic.

Today, the Conservatoire Royal de Bruxelles has just over 650 students who come from five continents - 75% from outside Belgium - and they are taught by around 230 teachers. The courses are offered at university level, and are organised and recognised by the Federation Wallonia-Brussels, and equip graduates of the Conservatoire with excellent professional perspectives.

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The Royal Conservatoire of Liège is a Federation Wallonia-Brussels School of Arts which offers high level artistic training (Bachelor's, Master's and Teaching Diplomas) in the field of music and theatre.

Founded in 1827, it is one of Europe's oldest conservatoires, offering a professionally-orientated music course.

Hosting about thirty students at the time it was created, the Conservatoire's population saw a rapid increase in the XIXth century. At the time, the school trained some notable musicians, including César Franck, Eugène Ysaÿe and Henri Vieuxtemps. The Royal Conservatoire of Liège has steadily worked on its structure and developed over the course of the XXth century. In 1930, the school's Theatre section was created. Since the 1970s, especially on the initiative of Henri Pousseur, the school has become a wonderful place for contemporary creation, in music and theatre alike. An artistic institution of international renown, it now hosts more than 350 students and has about one hundred tutors.

Since 2014, Nathanaël Harcq has been the Director of the Royal Conservatoire of Liège (in charge of training actors). A new Director in the field of Music will be appointed soon.

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Founded in 1927 by the architect and interior designer Henry van de Velde, the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Visuels de La Cambre (ENSAV) is one of the leading art and design schools in Belgium. It has 850 students in 20 art departments or workshops: ceramics, animation, drawing, urban space engraving and printmaking, painting, photography and sculpture, as well as a department of conservation and restoration of works of art and, in the field of design, options in industrial design and textile design, book and paper design (bookbinding), interior design, scenography, accessories, fashion design and creation, and two graphic design departments - visual and graphic communication, typography. Two new courses had started in September 2020: Texts and Literary Creation and in September 2021: Master in Dance and Choreographic Practices (training organised exclusively at Master level).

Students are also offered a range of cross-disciplinary artistic practices, both compulsory and optional: digital arts, life modelling and perspective, colour, video, performance and body arts, book arts and illustration, etc. In addition to their artistic training, students receive sustained theoretical and technical training, both general and specialised, and are encouraged to undertake work placements outside the school: Erasmus, artists' assistantships, placements in art centres, agencies or companies, etc. The course lasts 5 years and is divided into 2 cycles: Bachelor's and Master's degrees. The school also offers post-graduate training for the Agrégation - for those wishing to teach art - and prepares students for the Doctorat en art et sciences de l'art, organised jointly with the University. Outside the curriculum, it organises a propaedeutic course during the school year and a summer course, both aimed at students in their final year of secondary education who wish to pursue higher studies at an art school.

The school's first distinctive feature is that its teaching focuses on the visual arts. At Le 75, images are approached in all their diversity of practices and uses, as well as in their modes of production and distribution.

The second distinctive feature of the 75 programme is that it is taught intensively over three years. It demands a major commitment from the people who make it happen, and particular attention is paid to ensuring that the course ends with successful formal proposals, presented to the public at an exhibition held outside the school at the end of the juries' term.

LE 75 constantly strives to keep in touch with the outside world through field exercises, professional guest speakers, study visits, internships and national and international exchanges (Erasmus +), so as to equip students to deal with the society in which they will be called upon to exercise their talents.

In addition to their speciality class, they will have workshops in show creation, academic courses, and required independent projects, as well as classes in dance, acting, music, hand-balance, and acrobatics.

Established in 1970, the IMEP (Institut Supérieur de Musique et de Pédagogie) is a place of creativity and freedom hinged on a long tradition of teaching. The teaching offered is multidisciplinary and based on research, creation and opening up to the world of arts, people and society: it offers higher education, training for artists, educators and social players, adjusted to the realities of contemporary society.

The institute assigns a special place to research in musical teaching and posturology. The teaching body of the IMEP consists of recognised artists-actors, composers and teachers. A total of 471 students are enrolled at the IMEP, of whom approximately 28% are of foreign origin.

The IMEP offers three-year training courses (Bachelor's degree) in music teaching and five-year options (Master's) in instruments, singing, musical computing, music theory and writing. The IMEP also delivers higher education teaching qualifications in one year, completing the Master's degree.

The school also welcomes young talents, who are waiting to achieve the diploma required to embark on higher musical studies full-time. Each year, a season of concerts, conferences, masterclasses and musical meets is organised. This allows students to attend and take part in the performances and assure visibility to the teaching projects beyond and outside the school.

In practice, WBI's mission takes the form of five activities:

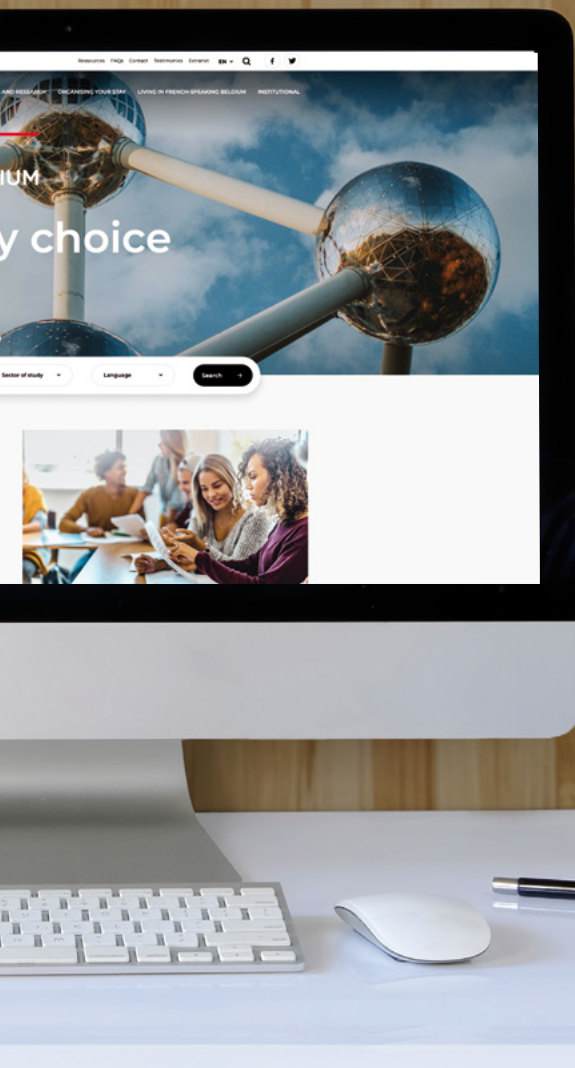
- Diplomatic representation
